DR. JEFF M. DIAMANTI

Professor of Environmental Humanities, University of Amsterdam, Netherlands

Jeff Diamanti has contributed to a number of works on energy culture and is part of the University of Alberta's Petrocultures and Rice University's Center for Energy and Environmental Research in the Human Sciences (CENHS). Diamanti has edited a number of books and journal collections and his work appeared in many international journals. His new research, Bloom Ecologies, details the return to natural philosophy in the marine and atmospheric sciences. He co-directs the ASCA Political Ecologies Seminar with Joost de Blooois, and with Amanda Boetzkes, he co-organizes "At the Moraine," an ongoing research project on the political ecology of glacial retreat in the Arctic.

New Directions in Environmental Humanities Research: Agency, Energy, Alterity

This talk offers an overview of the key conceptual pivots around which environmental humanities research developed since the early 1990s to the present. I return to key debates and then summarize what I take to be the analytic achievements in the field—including ecopoetics, materialist feminism, energy humanities, and elemental analytics—and conclude by arguing that 21st century political ecologies have already been fundamentally reframed due to the interdisciplinary pressure and ambition of the environmental humanities.

DR. SAID MENTAK

Professor of English, Mohammed I University, Oujda, Morocco

Said Mentak was a visiting lecturer to The Jacksonville State University in Alabama, USA. He translated many books and published many articles on Islam, cultural studies, and postmodern culture. In 2015, he started a master's program in Green Cultural Studies and organized an international conference on Culture and Ecology in June 2018. He is still in charge of the master's program at the same University, where he has been teaching since 1988. He is supervising about seven doctoral dissertations on different aspects of environmental criticism and ecocritical pedagogy.

The Ecological Digital Humanities: Using Technology to Circulate Ecological Messages

With the emergence and expansion of digital platforms, which offer unlimited movements and different scales, ecological issues or images have reached wider audiences all over the world. Either in education or digital media, the ecological crises have become accessible to specialists and laypeople alike; more than that, such digital tools have improved human understanding and provided crowdsource information about water systems and reforestation, for instance. Also, with the emergence of digital platforms, it has become possible to alter humanities research on ecology into computational humanities and develop the potential of environmental texts into accessible online resources.
